Overview

The Graduate Certificate in Public Health consists of core and elective coursework in the areas of epidemiology, biostatistics, health economics, social science research methods for public health, public health policy and evaluation, health systems and advocacy, occupational, environmental, and global health and infectious disease epidemiology and control.

The Graduate Certificate in Public Health is an AQF Level 8 qualification with a standard full-time duration of 0.5 years.

Conditions

Interruption of program: Students must apply for permission from the Program Coordinator or Delegate before taking a Leave of Absence.
